The fact that he is as quick as he is for his size is a luxury in today's NFL with it predominantly being an pass happy league.

SUMMARY



I can see Shazier being a late first rounder, because of his smarts and ability to fly around the ball. This kid has stats that speak for themselves, 22 1/2 tackles for a loss and his ability to get by blockers before the point of attack is what makes me like him even more. Either defensive scheme he can adjust, but that 3-4 is where his ability to excel will pay dividends in the long run.

WEAKNESSES

I don't see holes in Ryan's game the ceiling on his potential is unlimited, my only concern is that many scouts see him as being undersized at 6'2 233 lbs. as not being a good weight for his position.
